COVID-19 program update-Alberta (fall 2025)

To streamline access to COVID-19 vaccines in the fall, the Government of Alberta is adjusting its previously announced four-phased rollout plan that will begin in October. Phase 1 appointments for eligible Albertans will begin on October 1, 2025, and will be free-of-charge. Phase 2 appointments for all other Albertans, pending vaccine availability, will begin on October 20, 2025, and there will be a \$100 administrative fee charged to the patient. As part of this approach, pharmacies will be eligible to provide COVID-19 and influenza vaccine as part of the Alberta Outreach Immunization Program.

Outreach COVID-19 and influenza immunization program vaccine allocation

Primary Care Alberta will continue to lead and coordinate the Alberta Immunization Outreach Program for senior congregate care settings. Owners and operators of senior congregate care settings are responsible for arranging immunization services for residents. Pharmacies offering immunizations in senior congregate care will coordinate with facilities to confirm participation and provide information for vaccine distribution. Pharmacy providers will need to coordinate with facility staff and supply key operational details about the locations they will provide immunization services for.

Immunization providers participating in Alberta's Outreach Immunization Program are expected to follow all relevant regulations and policies, including timely electronic submission of immunization data, reporting adverse events and ensuring proper vaccine storage, handling and inventory management practices. Providers must assess vaccine eligibility and support catch-up immunizations. Providers should conduct **three** immunization visits during peak respiratory illness season. Influenza and COVID-19 vaccines must be offered to all residents. Immunization can be offered to congregate care staff if vaccine doses remain after all residents are immunized. Additionally, when vaccine supply is received by your pharmacy to support outreach immunization activities, health care workers involved in these efforts may be immunized immediately to enable timely rollout, protect staff, decrease transmission to residents and ensure continuity of services.

The Alberta Outreach Immunization Policy will be posted on the Alberta Immunization Policy (AIP) website (https://www. alberta.ca/alberta-immunization-policy). This includes eligibly criteria as well as roles and responsibilities for pharmacies participating in the Outreach Immunization Program.

In September, Primary and Preventative Health Services will email each participating pharmacy with the final vaccine allocations, and the primary pharmacy wholesale distributor will prioritize vaccine delivery. The Alberta Outreach Immunization program for COVID-19 and influenza vaccines will start October 1, 2025.

There will be no administrative fee charged for outreach eligible populations who wish to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Pharmacies providing outreach will still be able to bill through Alberta Blue Cross®, for the administration fee of provincially funded vaccines.

Influenza vaccine information fall 2025

In fall 2025, all influenza vaccine available will be a trivalent vaccine. The influenza vaccine available for seniors' will be Fluad, an adjuvanted influenza vaccine. The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) considers the adjuvanted influenza vaccine is as effective as the high dose influenza vaccine. The committee has also removed the preferential recommendation for high dose vaccine.

The following vaccines may be distributed to pharmacies for the fall 2025 influenza immunization season.
